Since becoming a quadriplegic and a full time wheelchair user, Kevin found new outlets for his sporting desires. At age 18 Kevin became the youngest board member of the Eastern Shore Recreation Commission serving in all Executive capacities including President Kevin became majority owner of the Eastern Shore Jr Mariners Junior "B" Hockey Club (later the Cole Harbour Colts) in 2006 and serving on the Executive of the Nova Scotia Junior Hockey League until selling his stake in 2013. In 2013 Kevin decided to focus on the most important role of a being "a sporting dad" to his children's growing sporting commitments. In this role, Kevin has visited nearly every arena, ballfield and horse barn in the province over the past 10 years or so. Kevin has been the Vice President of the Dartmouth District Minor Baseball Association since 2018. Kevin has been a champion and advocate for enabling persons with disabilities to have full participation in all aspects of society for the past 35 years. He has sat on many boards, agencies and commissions to numerous to mention. In his role as MLA, Kevin played a leadership role in creating the provinces Accessibility Act in 2017. Kevin brings a unique perspective to our discussion with his experience as a sporting participant, parent, administrator and elected official.
